

Sunday

*I become conscious of a sound. A persistent sound. It doesn't stop. It's my alarm clock. I reach over to turn it off. I look at the time. It's 7:45 am. It's time to get up. It's time to get ready for another day. But today is not just any other day. It is Sunday. Sunday...
A Sunday in January.
A Sunday in 2021.*

As the sleep from my eyes and the fog from my brain clear away, the wheels of my mind begin turning. Questions.

Will it be a drive-in service? Will we step out of our vehicles? Will we go inside the meeting house? Will the police ticket us? Will the protesters be parked along the side of the road? What will happen? Will our friends and brethren from Toronto be there? Questions.

I reach for my Bible. I wonder where to read. I turn to Isaiah.

I get down on my knees to pray.

"Lord, please bless the service today! Help us to trust You. Please be with us, Lord!"

I comb my hair. Thinking.

I eat breakfast. I check the time. It's 9:30. We leave in half an hour.

I periodically look at my phone, checking if any messages concerning this morning's service have come in. None.

9:45am I quickly finish some last minute things.

9:50am I put on my winter coat. It's cold outside. And it gets cold in the vehicle.

I put on my Sunday shoes.

I grab my Bible.

9:55am Time to go. My family is waiting in the truck.

The drive to the meeting house is short—five minutes. As we near the meeting house, we see that vehicles have begun to line the shoulders of the road. Most of them belong to protesters. We pull onto the meeting house property. Church of God security team members stand at intervals along the driveway. Some of the team members direct parking. We park on the grass along the side of the driveway. We face the meeting house. There is a trailer stage set up in front of the

meeting house. Speakers, facing the parking lot, have been set up.

We weren't the first ones to arrive. We recognize the vehicles of some of our friends, who have already arrived. We watch as more visitors and friends show up. Some are not just "visitors" anymore—they have become a part of the family.

There is a general feeling of excitement and anticipation in the air.

We tune in to the 87.9 FM radio station. Sounds of singing come over the airwaves.

10:22am Some of the visitors get out of their vehicles to greet one another. And then...

A dark blue Subaru, followed by a grey Volkswagen Tiguan, pulls onto the driveway. It is our beloved pastor, Bro. Henry Hildebrandt!!! He is greeted with smiles, waves, and honks.

10:27am Drive-in service will begin shortly.

Pastor Hildebrandt (the name by which Bro. Henry is affectionately known) walks down the parking lot waving at, and greeting, the visitors.

10:30am Five singers file onto the stage. According to restriction regulations, only five people are permitted to be outside for the service. The song leader announces, "Number 333! Sing along with us!"

"Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine..."

The singing is finished. A brother takes the stage and shares a powerful Scripture, and then he leads us in prayer.

After a pause...

Our beloved pastor walks up on stage! Two brothers stand with him on stage to back him up. The audience, honking their car horns, excitedly welcomes Bro. Hildebrandt.

Bro. Hildebrandt greets the crowd. And now it's time to hear from heaven.

Periodically vehicles drive by and honk their displeasure. A police SUV drives slowly by.

We sit under an open heaven as Bro. Hildebrandt preaches. "Don't mess with God! You can do nothing *against* the Truth, but *for* the Truth!"

There are many ways the audience is backing the preacher. One man sticks a Bible or a cross out of his car's sunroof. Most agree by honking their car horns.

11:26am Bro. Hildebrandt is speaking a few closing remarks.


We end the service with prayer. Truly, God blessed us with an amazing service!

This story is one of many stories that could have been written. There have been numerous times when we would exit our vehicles and stand outside in a group around Bro. Hildebrandt as he preached.

In the summer and fall of 2020, benches facing the stage would be set out on the parking lot for visitors and saints to sit on and enjoy the service. The ministers and choir would sit behind the stage. On other occasions, we have gone into the meeting house. But no matter what has happened or what will happen, God has been and always will be, "a very present help in time of trouble."



Sis. Tamara S. (Age 10)


